# History of the Montgomery Greys

## Original Organization

The -Aldntgomery (Greys entered the ('enfthlerate Service in Mav Lsdl, Sam (L Haribiwa.v, ('aptain, and was one of the tweh'e comiunies that compcisi'd the tith Inlantr.v RegimtMit, .Alaliama A'ohmteers. ;is sliewn by copies of letters herein, and other evidences now in possession of the iirent company, one of which is the ""old Flag" bearing the name of the "Jlont.gomery (xi'e.vs" painted in geld letters through the centre, and was presented to the compan.v upon the eve of their departure for the \,rniy of .Xorthei'ii A'irginia. This rlig w-is brought home from A'irginiji b\ ("jcporal Alike Duftie. and after the I'e-di'gani-zation nf the comiiany. during the term of ("aptain Lihn (;;iuo AA'inter. it was delivered to the present company.

Other records show that during thie AA'ar of Secessinu the comiian.v was engaged in a large number of skirmishes, and the folliwiing great r.jittles :

The Company first enlisted for "twelve months" at the end of which time, in 1862, they re-enlisted "for three years or during the war"

At the time of re-enlistment the following men joined the ranks:—Cluiton, Frank M. Jones, Mulder Lord, Marion Duffie, Milton Porter, Richard Rathwell, and Thomas Rusk.

The survivors of the original organization, so far as it has been able to ascertain, and who are living at this date, January 1st, 1888, are Philip J. Maher, Frank M. Jones, T. P. Pooth, (George Green, Mulder Lord, Seth D. Cline, John D. Maxwell, and Richard Rathwell.

The following interesting extracts throw light on the early history of the Company and regiment, and are given in full:

Mo. (dAip:RA) (RP:YS.—C—P'I. II—KII—W—Y.—This able and efficient Company turned out yesterday, for the purpose of receiving a magnificent banner, presented them as a token of the high appreciation in which they are held by our citizens. The presentation speech was made by Judge Phelan and responded to by our talented young townsman, Lieut. George Goldthwaite. Alas! regret we did not have an opportunity of witnessing the interesting ceremonies.

Col. SKIUKI'S REGIMENT.—This is perhaps one of the finest Regiments that has ever been mustered into service in our State and is a commanding officer. Col. Seibels is few equals. Ave

are not yet apprized of the time when this Regiment vsdll leave, nor positively of their place of destination; we understand, however, that the understanding UOAA' is, that they Avill go to Uniontown, Tennessee. For the benefit of those who may wish to witness a splendid Military display, we will state that a Battalion drill takes place at the Race Track, every afternoon at li o'clock.

The extracts are from *The Dailij Post*, Montgomery, Alabama, Tuesday, May 21, l.Sill, the original flies of Avhich are preserved in the collections of the Department of \rchives and History at the State Capitol.

\s further illustrating the early history of the Company a copy of a letter received from Philip E. Maher, the Lieut, in command at the surrender is given:

New York, :\arch 10th, 1890.

Th;it the name of ("apt. Sam. Hardaway s Company, the Gth \la. Reg., is in doubt bv any citizen of ^lontgdiner.v is one of the surprizes of m.v life. It is painful to think, that there is a man in .vour cit.v, that knows so little of us as not to know our name. For their benefit, I will state a few facts. I became a member of ("apt. Hardawa.v's Company in ^la.v, isijl, au,i its name was then, the ;Montg.imerj' Gre.vs, and continued so to the end of the war. AAè received a flag bearing our name through its centre, iircseuted to us bv the Ladies of Montgomery before we left home. It was borne bj' our color sergeant until the State Flag was intrusted to his care. The same gallant member of the ^Montgemery (Jreys met his death carrying the Confederate Battle Hag of the llth \la. Regiment. Our twelve companies brought to the regiment their local names, and they were known by them to the end. Capt. Hardaway was never known to call his compan.v by its regimental letter. He called us the (Jreys. when he tried to be severe: The pres-



ent comiian.v of .voiiiig gentlemen, the prize winners of our counli'.v, tte Vdung soldiers peri^etuatiig our name, need not lilnsh or ajHildgize tor the i-ccdnl of the old company. Its history is the hislory of the Clh -Via. Uegiiiiienl, with General Jacksou. Ewell, Rhodes, E;irly. and our (ieneral (icardon. From Manassas to .\ppoinattox the ...<iiitgomery Creys well sustained on many a blood.v field the c.-iuse and lidiior of the onth. I am proud to think that the young M<intgdmery vjrcys. whom I met in .-Vpril issd at the li;,\-iiiig of the cdrnerstorc oi a monument td commemorate the giuiant sons of .Alabama, felt it their duty td see tli.it the Veterans df the Old (;re,\s, still retain the name and staudin.g they are bA' ever.v right entitled to. It is natural that I should be iironed of them, as I held every position in the ^Montgomery (ire.vs df "(SI from Corpioral td Lieutenant, and was its onLA' commissioneil etticer diirin.g the menidr;itble period, from the battle of (Gettysburg to the Surrender at .Vppomattox. In the name of the patriotism shown b.v all the confederate soldiers of ^lontgomer.v, let there be no one at the I'resent da.v de.generate enough to refuse their memorj' the simple .justice of honored recognition. The.v did their duty as soldiers, and 'is they have nearLA' all iassed aA'i;y, their successors should be encouraged to ket^p up their name and glorious record.

say, that I joined the Montgomery Greys about the first of April 18(31, and in May the Company went into camp at the race track near Montgdiuery, and Avas there mustered into the Confederate Service Avith:

The original offi<ers I cannot call to mind, but I do not think that I ever heard of the company being called the "Irish Greys" until I was in Montgomer.v at the last State Reunion, when some one brought the matter up with .John M.-ixwell in my presence, but we were mustered into service as the Montgomer.v (Jreys, and while I was with the company, Capt. Ilardaway al-wa.vs called to us when in line, with the words. "-Vttmition Montgdiuery (ire.vs." and dur Regiment letter was •Co. (i. (ith .\la." We enlisted for twelve months, and at the exi>iration tile regiment was reergauized ;ind re-enlist(>d for the war, the letter of the compan.v was c^hanged. (apt. Ilardaw.-iy resigned, tilsd Lieut. Clanton, and the following were elected:

Put the company left .Aleitgdiiery •S the Mdiit,i;(imery (ireys. under tlie "did flag" that bangs in the armory and I have a piece el' that old flag now, and I never lieard of the name "Irish"" put to it, although the name might have lieeii siigiesii'd wh(>n it was first made up in ISdO, when .Vlliert Elnidi'c was Captain, .-is there were several Irishmen in it. and I am Irish myself, but I jeined the :M(jntgomery (U'ey's, and never heard of the other name until alidut three years agd, lint if nothing happens, I will lie in Mdiit.gomery at the State Reunidi then I hope td meet you. ITtli. and L'ltli, I will tr.v to ,gi\c you what inforimitiim I c;in, but will sa.\' new thiit I w;is onlv with "-Alontgomer.v (Jreys" fi"(an -April Iscl to Feb, 11th, IS(i;', I flrst joined (Ipelika \ol-unteers di'gani/-ed bv ('ajit. Jinks Tbdrrntdu, of Russell ('duntv. -Via. -\fter di'g.-iniziiig. the compan.v wcid to Aleitgdiierv' and dftered tlieir ser\i<'es to (Jciv. ^Mdore, but from seme c-iuse was net accepted. AA'bereupdii the cdm|iany was disbanded most of Ihi-m geing back ki Ojielika. There were about thirteen of us that stayed in -Alditgomery, and joieil the ".Moiit-dmerv

(ireys"" which was then organizing under Capt. Sam. Hardaway. I believe the commissioned officers were elected before I joined and the non-commissioned officers after I joined.

I will give you the names of the (Jielika Volunteers who joined with me the "Mdtgdinery (Ireys" Thadeus X. Tenies. I JUL'1 John Chafin. Willis Barnes. Harry Clayton, Elislia Carpenter, James Carney, Hugh Lavel. James Mc(innis, (Iariou McDuffie. (ames Hilliary, Louis Steed. James (avanaugh, F AL Jones, and probably others who I do not remember.

And now I notice some errors in the list of names you sent me. First I notice William Jones (JUL'1 which should be Thadeus X. Jones (John (William was another brother of mine who belonged to 12th. (ia. instead of 11th. (ia., also William Rusk instead of Thomas Rusk. I also remember a few who are not on the list: John Chafin. William Barnes, (George Jones, and James Hilliary.

I do not know anything about the company after reorganizing on the (li-my brother Silas who is now dead. If the letter of the company was ever (in (red I never knew it. I certainly appreciated the books you sent me also the names of the (li-comrades, as I intend to write each due to (m. The reason I left (li- (re, (s" was because several out of each (mpany formed what was known as "AA'addells (Vrtillet, (nf (ia." Out of ("ompany (" there were (self. M. AA Lord. (AcDuftv, Rusk, and Itathwell. and others (Ojelika (ohmteers afterwards (in (ed under (apt. J. F. AA'aidell. and joined (th. (ia. at (Abmt (omery. known as ("ompany "H"

I do not remember how many men there were in the (li- when we left for (Virginia. I think your list of officers is correct. I would be (li- to hear from you at any time, and (nv- thing I can help you (li- let me know. I (li- have to have (li- one do not writing for me. My Dear ('aptain:—

It .itt'ords me grc;it jileasure to furnish you with such information as I have relating to .your iniinirics.

My father .Alichael .McDonough. and my luother John J. McDonough. joined the Montgomery (ireys at the time the cimpany was org:ini/ed early in l.sdl. The company enlisted in the confederate service and become "Com]i;in,\" C". bth. .Ala. Inf., and soon after the organization of the ri>giinent, they were shipped to A'irginia.

My father w.is killel at the battle of Seven Pines, May 31st. IS(2. -Aly brother was wounded in the knee and was a prisoner at Point Lookout, at the time of the surrender.

Just prior to the compan.v leaving Montgomery, m.v brother lijid this deguerreot.vpe taken in uniform, the picture is now in m.v jiossession, and the letters "M d" are still plainly visible on his hat,

I remember the original company well, and ncA'er knew or heard of them being called by auA' other name than Montgomer.v (ireys. I alsn rtmieinoer the jiresmtnation of thie old flag td the cdni]iany on South Court Street.

My Dear ('aptain:—

In repl,v to .\our empiiries rel-itive to my recollections and

membership of the "Montgomery Greys, IS61-(i."i", I beg to state that, I came to Montgomer.v in IS-iT. and have lived here continuously ever since, with exception of the time that I was in the Confederate Army, and a short time since the war that I was in Mississijipi.

.Abimt the latter part of .April, or early in Ma^, LSiU, Captain Sim. (i. Ilardaway, Xat. Clanton, John -AlcCarty. (ieo. AA' (ioldthwaite. and others, made up a military company, to enlist in the Confederate -Vrmy for twelve months.

AAe met in a Hall over the stores formerly occuuiid by Lehman. Durr iV Co.. and organized the company, and by a vote .iadopted the name of ".Alontgomer,\ Gre.\s," AVe elected Sam. (i. Hardaway. ( ••iptain; X.'it. ('lanton, 1st Li(>ut.: John McCarty 2nd Lieut.: (ieo. W Coldthwiite. .lid Lieut.; John Lawler, 1st Se.ii'gt.; Thomas Slattery, 2nd S(>argt.: .VI. Hutchinson, 3rd Se.-irgt.; Pat. I)or;ni, 4th Seargt. also ('olor Sc.-irgt.: John Mullins. 1st Corporal; Philip E. .Alaher, Ind Corporal; James K.ine. ;ril ('or]ioral: Frank M. Jones, 4th Corpm^al.

In making up the eompany. about flfteen men came from the neighbiirhood of ,(,pelika. .Via., among the number, I remember that there were. Joseph l'..irnes, Harry Clayton, Elislia Car-|ieiiter, James C.'irney. Ilugli I--ivel. •l:imes Mctiinness, [Marion McDuff'ie, James Illilli:iry. Louis Steed. James ('avanaugh, l'"rank M. Jones. Silas Jiaies, Tli.-ideus \. Jones (Jug). AAe also had from Pike ( ount.v, .Tacob Kirksey Jiflm Mullins and others.

AAe went into camp at the old "l;,-ice Tr.-ick" where the (Ith .Via. Regt. was being organized. The ladies of Montgomer,v made a very fine silk Hag. bound in gold fringe, with gold letters •"Montgomery (ire.xs" painted through the centre, one day C.-ip-taiu Ilard.'iway. marched tlic compan.v into the city, and down South Court Street, to the intersci-tion of Cla.\ton Street, there we found a large number of citizens, men. women, ;ind children, awaiting tor the presentation of the flag to the com|iaiiy, it was aliout eleven o'clock in the morning. Judge Phelan made the ]resentation sjieech, and Lieut. (ieo. (ioldthwaite received it. and handed tlie fiag to Color Seargt. Pat. Doran. the company then marched back to camp, with the flag flying.

-After the organization of the (1st -Via. Regt., had been completed, with Colonel Seibles (commanding, and the companies lettered, their companies become "(Co. G" which letter we kept until the first twelve months enlistment had expired, and upon the re-organization our letter was changed to "(Co. H" I do not remember that the letter was ever changed after that time. At the time of re-enlistment several of our company left us and joined AA'adells Artillery, among the number were Frank M. Jones, Aluider AA' Lord. Varion AlcDuffie. Thomas Rusk, Richard Rathwell.

AA' left Alongomer with 12(1 officers and men, and received several recruits afterwards, but I cannot recall all of their names, but the eight survivors of the original Longoinery (re-vs. Inve made up a roll from names, a number of names have been left off, for want of memory, so the roll is incomplete, the survivors herein hand you the roster as made up to date.

After the first year's service, Captain Hardaway, resigned, also Lieut. Clanton, Lieut. (ieo. (oldthwaite, had been dismissed. Adjutant at the time we were first organized.

At the re-organization, or re-enlistment in Virginia in 1862 John [McCarty, was elected captain, Thonnis Slattery, 1st Lieut.; John Lawler, 2nd Lieut.; Philip E. [Maher, 3rd Lieut.; Captain AlcCarty was killed. Lieut. Slattery, was promoted to captain, and was wounded, came home and died after the war. Lieut. Lawler, was promoted to captain, and mortally wounded, came home and died. James Kane was promoted to Lieut, and lost one of his legs in battle. This left us with only one commissioned officer, Lieut. Philip E. Maher. He was wounded at (ietysburg, but continued through to the surrender at Vppomattox.

Mike Duffie, James Healy, and AAm. Mixwel, were appointed Corporals as vacancies occurred (during their long service. Duffie was wounded several times very severely, and sent home at one time, and he was not able for duty for many weeks, but when able he came back to the (Hiipan. At the time he was sent home, he brought with him the old flag that had been presented to us by Ala., BSCI. After the war was over, and the

Montgomery (ireys, had been re-organized, DufCie carried the flag to Capt. AA'inter and dellA'ered it through him to the company again, the same old flag is now in their possession. AVhen we left Montgomer.v we carried the flag as re,gimental colors for some months, but the .government furnished the regiment with standard reguhition cidors. and our company flag was not used afterward.

I was wounded through both thighs at one time, at another time, I Av;is wounded through the left thigh and left arm, at the time of the surrender, I was not able to be with the active company, but was with the ambulance train, and wagons.

The survivors of the compan.v now living, so far ;is it has been possible to learn are: T. AA' Booth, Seth D. Conner. Frank AL Jones. Mulder AV Lord, John D. .Maxwell. Richard Rathwell. I'hiliji E. [Maher, and (ieorge (ireen. Tlir(>e of the number after the flrst year"s service went with "AA'addells .Vrtillery."

.V man aiijiroached me a few <lays ago and emiured of me. what I remembered ab mt a military company that was organized in [Montgi-imery just prior to the wai' named "Irish Greys"? I am very glad to have liad the opportunity to make the foregoing st.'itements to the "[Montgomery (ireys I{(>tired Corps" but it would take a big Imok to tell all that we did, hardships, service, and battles and other matters that occurred during our four years service.

I am now growing to be very old, crippled and know that my time here is short at best, and so it is with the other survivors.

Wishing cacli of you a long and pros]ierons life, and that A">II may never be called on to go into war, but should such fate befall you, I know that every "Montgomery Grey" will do his whole duty,

I receiv(nl Aour letter, with a copy of the roster of the old Montgomery (ire.A's, ISdl-i;-., now being made up from memory b.\ the few survivors of the old company. I would have answered sooner but have been studying the roll, tr.ving to bring to niemor.v some of the names and history.

The list of officers is correct, and the men also, as far as I can remember, there are a few men mentioned on the roll that I do not remember anything about, and there are a number that should be on the roll, but I cannot recall their names.

The "Montgomery (ire,\s" were organized in Montgomery, earl.v in l.Siil. and were in the Oth .Ala. Infantr.v, the flrst year it was "Co. (i" then they chiinged it to "Co. II" and kept that letter throughout the war.

The last officers we had were Lieuts. Pliilip E. Maher, and James Kane, but Coriioral Heal.v had been promoted for bravery, but was taken prisoner, and never received his commission.

On the roll I see the name of Ed. Meggs, I knew him as Eugene Meggs, that man servi»d throughout the AAar, and surrendered with me at -Vp(iiomattox. Va.. and ;tfterward Avent with me to Xew Orleans.

I joined the -Alontgomery (ireys at the organization of the comiian.v, and served throughout the entire Avar, and never missed anything except when I was in the hospit;il from wounils. I was wounded se\en times, had one half the bone siiiit out of my left arm. Our regiment was geui-i'ally known as "The Bloody Sixth," C;i]itain John P.. (iordon, who commanded a comiiany from Jackson County, named •Raccoon Rouglis"", was promoted from time, to time, until before the

war closed he had become "Our Own" Lt. Gen'l. John B. Gordon, C. S. A.

It has been a long time since the war, and I have forgotten many names, and circumstances connected with the long ago. I am proud to see, and know that the young men keep up the name of the old company.

If there is any other information that I can give you, I will gladly do so. Wishing you a happy new Year. Hoping to hear from you soon again. I am, Yours truly,

Mr. [M. H. Verner.

Dear Sir:—

I received your welcome letter of the 1-ith. inst., and was glad to hear from you. I was wounded at the first battle of the "Avildern's" in the hand, at the "Second battle" I was wounded severely in the foot, at Spotsylvania Court House, my arm was broken, I was wounded twice in [Maryland, I was wounded at Winchester.

The first man that we lost was from Ouelika, he shot himself accidentally at Fairfax, before the "First Battle of [Vlanasas" I think that his name was Jones. Joseph B. Barnes was from Ouelik; he lost his arm at the "Battle of Seven Pines" The "Bloody Sixth" lost more men at the "Battle of Seven Pines" than any regiment ever lost during the war in one battle, killed and wounded, without losing a single prisoner. The "reys" furnished the Color Bearer for the regiment. Mike Duffie was a "Color Bearer" Dennis Madigan was a "Color Bearer" was killed at the first "Battle of the Wilderness" Hugh Lavel was a "Color Bearer." he was wounded at Petersburg.

burg. There is another name that is not on the roll, that is a man by the name of Brown, he was killed in the "first Battle of the Wilderness" after he was killed the woods caught fire and he was burned up when the men went back to bury him. but they got his watch and sent it home to his people, ask Mr. [Maxwell, he will tell you all about him, if he dont, write to Lieuten. int. Maher, and he will tell you all about him. When you write to [Mr. Maher, please give him my kind regards, and tell him that I would be happy to meet him and shake his dear hand. Please tell Mr. Maxwell I have lost his address and I would be glad to write to him if I had his address.

I want to tell you about an old veteran friend of mine here in Blocton. his name is [Mr. Lee Hays, he is an old man of our little town and he is the man that gives me employment, and I was in his house the other day showing him all of your letters, and your buck, and he said that he "would give a thousand dollars if he had exchanged to the [Montgomery (reys)." Send my kind regards to all the old veterans. and all the young (reys. I will remain, Your friend.

The foregoing very inadequately presents the record of this gallant band of patriots, but it is sufficient to show the stuff they were made of. and it will doubtless be read with keen pleasure and interest by hundreds of their descendants.

# Descriptive Sketch of the Greys Annual Ball

January 28th, 1887

From the **Alontgomery** EVENING CAPITAL.

The decorations of Armory Hall for the annual ball of the Alontgomery (ireys are about complete. The committee in charge of the beautifying of the ball-room have been unremittingly engaged for the past ten days, and the result thus far achieved by them is a marvel of taste and splendor. To a (APir.Ai- reporter who examined their work this inoring the vast apartment presented the appearance of some gorgeous transformation scene in a modern spectacular drama. Ceilings and walls, caseiiiieits and doorwa.vs, cornices and wainscoting are tremulous with harmoniousl.v blended colors, radiant with burnished armour, and respleiidant with floral mottoes, deftly arranged devices and handsomel.v grouped pictures. The ragged surface of the roughl.v plastered walls flanked with two stairways which lead from the street to the armor.v aie concealed by he,i\.\ folds of red. white and blue liunting. caught up in long loops, and the ballustrades are hidden with gav colored cloth. The eiiitriiie doors are curtained with Fiiited States flags, fastened near the floor with eoi'ds and tassels. The curtain over the door leading into the (ireys room is he-iv.\ fluged chintz of a rich, old gold color, and is held in folds at the centre of the sides by brackets. Above this door the words "welcome" in large gold letters on a blue .m'inuid. crescent shaped, is seen: and pendant from the concave side of the crescent is hung a handsome golden sliield, with barsinister in silver, resting upon a mace and battle-ax crossed beneath it. On the shield in black (iotliic letters is written the •Alontgomery (ireys."

The sambre gained gum racks of the several companies of the Second Alaliamia Regiment, ranged along the north Avall, has



been made cheerful in masks of white, red and blue cloth, alternating their faces and relieved at the tops by rows of thickly studded national flags and graceful loops of varicolored bunting.

Around the entire interior extent of the rectangle formed by the line where ceilings and wall meet depend, with short intervals of distances between them, the flags of all nations. The tricolor banner of France smiles between the double-headed eagle of Russia and the lurid crescent of Turkey; the gold harp of Erin beams from its sunburst and field of green upon the British Lion and the helmeted head of St. George while the fat-cleeked moon of Japan sheds its blood-red glory from a pale background upon the spike-tailed dragon of the Chinese empire. Alidways between the floor and ceiling, along the south wall of the armor and above the gun racks, are suspended the mottoes of the several states of the Union, each framed in a red and white barred shield, wreathed with flowers; The five immense chandeliers extending through the centre of the ballroom present pyramids of flags of all nations, crowned with a tier of United States flags. From the basis of the chandeliers, long round columns of red and white festooning stretch out like the radii of five enormous stars, intertwining and crossing each other in every direction, and caught up at the edges of the ceiling in graceful loops. The beautiful company flags of the Second Regiment, several battle-scarred banners, relics of the late war, and a number of trophies flags captured by the Old Grenades on the "foughten fields" of the war, hanging down in graceful tracery from colored cords, complete the adornment of the ceiling of the ball room.

The band stand which occupies the central space against the opposite wall of the armor is a triumph of the art decorative. The rough wood work is concealed by a broad band of white, fully four feet in width, drawn around the ballustrades and trimmed at the top and bottom edges with narrow breadths of red and white cloth. Raised (Persian shields of alternating red and white cloth, with golden stars shining between their points from the white background, complete the decoration of

the lower section of the band-stand, while the upper is crowned with a heroic picture of America, represented by a glorious woman in a royal mantle of stars and stripes, flanked by tiny banners, flags and festooning.

Beginning at the eastern end of the hall and extending westward along the southern side are half-length portraits of the post bellum captains of the (regiments: AV B. "Jones, '72 to '73"; John (iano AA'inter, "74" to "75"; Tims. G. Jones, '76 to '77; Ed. V. (raham, "MI to 'S4 ; AL II. Amerine, elected captain in Alay, 'SI. Surrounding (Captain Vmerine's portrait are hung in gilt frames the names of the five prize-winning teams he has commanded. Victors at Louisville. Mobile, Philadelphia. Savannah and Aicksburg. Underneath the Captain's portrait is suspended a photograph of the company's team taken while going through the inter-state drill at Fairmount Park. Philadelphia. The adjoining window spaces along the southern side of the hall are filled with several pictures of the company officers, and photographs of trophies won and of tent and held scenes in which the (regiment's participated. The most venerated and noticeable picture along the southern wall has not yet been mentioned. It is a historical picture of the (regiment's organization in 1861 with a list in black letter type running through the centre of the principal battles they participated in during the war. beginning with the sunrise of victory at Antietam, and concluding with the midnight of defeat at Appomattox. This short and tragic story is surrounded by Confederate bills of various denominations and enclosed in a plain gilt frame.

On the left of the band stand, on a level with the inclosing railing, stands a life-size picture of a modern (regiment in the present full dress uniform of the company with streamers beneath its feet with the (regiment's victories won by the company inscribed on them; on the other side stands a counterfeit representation of the old (regiment of the war—a picket of the Potomac rises from the waves of color that surround him, clad in an (regiment army overcoat. his musket held at parade rest, and from under his slouch hat his eyes (regiment out with sad, stern light, as if to catch sight of some lurking enemy hid in an adjoining thicket.

.At the leet of the veteran is a handsome scroll containing the names of the battles in which the heroes took part during the war, and framed by his side are the lines, a tribute to the hero he wore so bravely and honorably through the privations of the marches and the storms of the battlefield :

Something so human hearted  
In a tint that ever lies,  
Here a splendor has just departed,  
.And a glory is yet to rise.

Grey in the sidemn gloaming;  
(here in the dawning skies;  
In the old man's crown of honor;  
In the little maiden's eyes.

Grey in the grand cathedral,  
Here the glories are poured.  
And with angel and archangel,  
Await the coining of the Lord.

Silvery gray for the bridal.  
Sable gray for the pall;  
For youth and age. for life and death,  
Ever the grey for all.

Each company bought their dress and fatigue uniforms with their own funds. The regiment purchased with its funds, their entire camp (Minipage, consisting of tents, crockery tin ware, cooking utensils, bladders, etc. The Government only supplied musket, carbines, guns, ammunition, harness, saddles and bridles.

Since that time Col. Thos. G. Jones has served two terms as Governor of Alabama, and is at present Judge of F. S. District Court, Middle District of Alabama. Captain (his) P. Jones resigned and served four years as Adjutant-General on Governor Jones' staff. Lt. A. S. Atkinson was elected Captain Altongonu (resigned) and Lieut. Ed. P. Amerine was elected, after his resignation. Lt. W. J. Poole was elected Captain, and resigned; and Lt. R. P. Stout was elected Captain of the Company. Alaj. R. E. Steiner resigned, and Adjutant J. P. Saffeld was elected Major; he resigned and Capt. R. P. Stout was elected Major of the regiment.

After the War of Secession for several years the organized militia was known as "Alabama Volunteer Militia." The name was changed by an act of the Legislature to "Alabama State Troops," and in later years changed to the "Alabama National Guard." Thus the old 2nd Regiment V. S., 1st, has become the 2nd Regiment A. X. G.
