Courses of Study.

College Preparatory Course.

This course is established to fit students for college.

In order to enter classes in this course, pupils must be thoroughly prepared in Reading, Writing, Arithmetic, Geography, English Grammar and United States History.

First Mear.

LATIN—Elementary Book, (Harkness); English Composition, —First Lesson, (Quackenbos'); History, General, (Switon's); Mathematics, Practical Arithmetic, concluded, (Davie's); Science, Phisiology, (Cutter's).

Fecand Year.

Latin-Reader, Grammar, (Bullions); Greek, Elementary Book.

(Anthons); Mathematics, Elementary Algebra, (Davie's); History, General, (Swinton's).

Third Ufear.

LATIN—Cicero—Four Orations against Cutiline, (Stuart); Virgil—Three Books of Æneid, (Chase); Composition, (Harkness).
GREEK—Xenophon's Anabasis, three books, (Boise).
MATHEMATICS—Geometry, four books, (Loomid).
Science—Physical Geography, (Manry).

NORMAL COURSE.

This course is established for the purpose of giving to all its participants such a common school education as will enable them to teach in this, or the adjoining States. It embraces four years.

For admission to this course, one must have a fair knowledge of Reading, Writing, Elements of Written Arithmetic, and Primary Geography.

Fiest Year.

English—Spelling, (Webster's Common School Dictionary); Reading, (McGuffey's Fifth); Grammar, (Smith's); Mathematics, Practical Arithmetic, (Davies'); Science, Intermediate Geography, (Cornell's).

Second Usear.

English—Composition, Grammar, (Smith's); Mathematics, Practical Arithmetic, (Davies'); History, United States, (Swinton's); Science, Georgraphy, Anatomy, Physiology and Hygiene, (Cutter's); Teaching, Theory and Practical, (Page); Book-keeping, (Mayhew.)

Third Mear.

English—Literature, (Gilman); Mathematics, Algebra, (Loomis); Science, Physical Geography, (Maury's); Astronomy, (Lockyer's); Geology, (Dana).

Fourth Mear.

English—Milton and Shakespeare, Rhetoric, Art of Discourse, (Day's); Mental Philosophy, (Wayland); Moral Philosophy, (Fairchild); Evidence of Christianity, (Hopkin's); Mathematics, Algebra, (Loomis') History of Education, (Hahlman's).

Primary Course.

This is for the accommodation of small children and others who are beginning the race for an education; under competent, kind and earnest tutorship. This department is prepared to thoroughly equip its pupils in spelling, reading, elements of written arithmetic, (Davies'); and in primary Geography, (Cornell's), etc.



Benerat Information.

Membership.

Any person of good moral character can become a member of this school at any time. Persons who are in, or desire to join either of the higher classes, will stand a better chance by coming the first day of school. Pupils are not allowed to attend parties, festivals pic-nics, etc., during school time, without special permission from the Principal. Parents and friends are earnestly requested to cooperate with the teachers in this matter.

Discipline

of this school is similar to that of all other well regulated schools. For any *persistent* and *gross* violation of the rules and regulations, a pupil is expelled. We have only had to resort to this final punishment once during our existence.

Theory and Practice of Teaching.

A splendid opportunity to gain experience in conducting recitations, etc., is afforded to the higher classes, by the primary pupils.

Each one who intends to teach is required to instruct some one of the infant classes under the criticisms of the whole school.

Thus initiated into their work, our pupils are not at a loss when they enter their summer schools.

Rhetorical Exercises.

Friday afternoon of each week is spent in hearing essays, speeches, debates, spelling-matchess, etc. By the latter. We go through the spelling book three times a year.

Literary Focieties.

There are two of tness societies controlled by the pupils themselves—J. C. Young, of Cuthbert, is President of the Demosthenian. Aaron Smith, of Columbus, President of the Eureka.
